Synopsis



While driving to a business dinner on the outskirts of Chongqing, Boss Li passes the body of an elderly shepherd killed in a highway hit-and-run. Pressed for time, she continues on her journey—but the encounter refuses to leave her.

Unable to move on, she returns to the scene. What begins as an attempt to make sense of one stranger's death gradually becomes a disorienting journey where memory, guilt, and reality begin to dissolve into one another.

Set against the rapidly changing landscape of contemporary China, *The Highway* is a psychological drama that explores the moral ambiguities of progress and asks what responsibility we bear when another person's suffering becomes little more than an interruption to our own lives.

Director's Statement

More than a decade ago, I was traveling through Chongqing before dawn when our taxi slowed beside the body of a man who had been killed on a newly constructed highway.

The driver didn't stop.

He explained that local farmers often crossed the highway to reach their fields, and that accidents like this happened more often than people realized. Then we continued on our way.

I caught my flight.

For years, I kept returning to that morning.

It wasn't simply the man's death that haunted me. It was how easily life continued afterwards. The driver kept driving. I continued travelling. The world simply moved on.

I never wanted to recreate that accident. I wanted to imagine what might happen if someone couldn't leave it behind. What if conscience refused to let go? What if a single moment continued unfolding long after everyone else had forgotten it?

That question became *The Highway*.

Although this is my first fiction film, it grows directly out of my years working in documentary. Documentary taught me to observe before interpreting, to trust silence, and to resist explaining everything. Those instincts shaped every creative decision we made.

Over time, the highway itself became more than a setting. It became a metaphor for the promises of progress and the lives too easily left behind.

Above all, I wanted to make a film that stays with the audience after it ends.

Not because it provides answers.

But because it leaves behind a question.

Yung Chang is a Chinese-Canadian filmmaker whose work explores the human consequences of social, political, and economic transformation through intimate, character-driven storytelling. His films include *Up the Yangtze*, *China Heavyweight*, *The Fruit Hunters*, *This is Not a Movie*, and the Emmy Award-nominated *Wuhan Wuhan*. *The Highway* marks his fiction debut and an important step toward his first narrative feature, *Eggplant*.

The Performers

Lu Huang — Boss Li



From her breakout performance as Bai Xuemei in *Blind Mountain*, to Xiao Man in *Blind Massage*, and the grieving mother in *The Crossing (San Fu Tian)*, Lu Huang has built a career playing complex, deeply human women. Widely regarded as one of China's leading arthouse actors, she is the only actress of her generation whose starring films have been selected for all three major European film festivals—Cannes, Berlin, and Venice. Western audiences may recognize her from her performance as Bebe Chow in the Hulu series *Little Fires Everywhere*, opposite Reese Witherspoon and Kerry Washington. Her distinctive screen presence and nuanced performances have earned her international acclaim, making her one of the most sought-after Chinese actors working with leading filmmakers around the world. In *The Highway*, her restrained performance anchors the film's quiet psychological journey.

Ryan Chen — Chinese Trump

Ryan Chen (Chen Rui) is a Chongqing-based performer and content creator known internationally as the "Chinese Trump" for his widely viewed Donald Trump impersonations. *The Highway* marks one of his first screen performances.



The Filmmakers

Yimin “Fanfan” Zhuang — Producer Flying Sparrow Films Ltd.

Yimin “Fanfan” Zhuang is a Beijing-based producer who has worked on more than fifty documentary and narrative productions with filmmakers from China and around the world. She oversaw the Chinese production and was instrumental in bringing together the film's Canadian and Chinese creative teams.



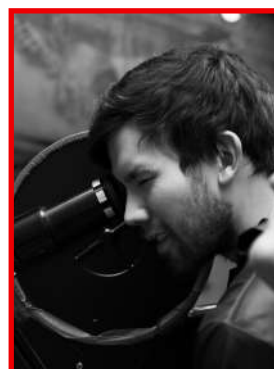
Dan Montgomery — Producer, MDFF

Dan Montgomery is a Canadian producer and co-founder of Medium Density Fibreboard Films (MDFF). His productions have screened at major international festivals including Cannes, Berlin, Venice, Locarno, SXSW, the New York Film Festival, and the Toronto International Film Festival. He helped guide *The Highway* from development through completion.



Christopher Lew — Director of Photography, CSC

Christopher Lew is a Canadian cinematographer whose work includes *Riceboy Sleeps*, *Quickenings*, *White Lie*, *Deli Love*, and *Closing Dynasty*. His naturalistic visual style and careful attention to atmosphere helped shape the distinctive visual language of *The Highway*.



Xi Feng — Editor

Xi Feng is an award-winning editor whose films have screened at Cannes, Berlin, Sundance, Visions du Réel, and DOC NYC. She received the Canadian Screen Award for Best Editing for *Universal Language*. Her measured editorial approach allows the emotional rhythm of *The Highway* to unfold with patience and restraint.



Alex Zhang Hungtai — Composer

Alex Zhang Hungtai is a composer, musician, and multidisciplinary artist whose film work includes *Godland*. His original score for *The Highway* moves subtly between atmosphere and memory, complementing the film's restrained emotional landscape.



Shing Pooi Goh — Art Director

Shing Pooi Goh is a Singaporean production designer and graduate of the Beijing Film Academy. Working across feature films, television, and commercial productions for more than thirteen years, she brings an international perspective grounded in a deep understanding of Chinese culture. For *The Highway*, she created a visual world defined by restraint, using carefully chosen details to reinforce the film's psychological tension and emotional realism.



Matthew Chan — Sound Supervisor & Re-Recording Mixer

Matthew Chan has collaborated on films by Sean Durkin, Atom Egoyan, Andrew Haigh, Brandon Cronenberg, Matt Johnson, and Agnieszka Holland, as well as acclaimed television series including *The Expanse* and *Halo*. His work on *The Highway* balances intimacy with a richly textured sense of place.



J.R. Fountain — Sound Designer

J.R. Fountain is an award-winning sound designer whose credits include *The Breadwinner*, *Scary Stories to Tell in the Dark*, and *Locke & Key*. His sound design for *The Highway* quietly blurs the line between physical space and psychological experience.



Production Notes

How twenty years of making documentaries influences directing fiction: On working with Lu Huang:

When I attended the Sundance Screenwriters Lab and Directors Lab in 2015, I wondered whether I was actually capable of directing fiction. But over those two weeks, I realized many of the skills I'd developed making documentaries were some of my greatest strengths.

Documentary teaches you to adapt. Locations change, time disappears, the weather shifts, and the unexpected happens. You learn to stay calm, solve problems in the moment, and never lose sight of the story.

Fiction is planned much more meticulously, but once production begins, things inevitably go sideways. That's where my documentary experience became invaluable. It taught me to stay flexible without compromising the integrity of the film.

I also loved the collaborative nature of fiction. Working with Christopher Lew, Xi Feng, Alex Zhang Hungtai, the cast, and crew reminded me that filmmaking is never a one-person endeavour. Everyone contributes to the same emotional truth.

On acting and directing:

Before filmmaking, I studied acting at the Neighborhood Playhouse School of the Theatre in New York, where I trained in the Meisner Technique. *The Highway* gave me the opportunity to reconnect with that part of my artistic education.

Meisner taught me to focus less on performance and more on behaviour—to listen, respond, and trust what happens truthfully between actors. That shaped the way I approached rehearsals and performances. Rather than asking actors to demonstrate emotion, I wanted to create an environment where they could simply inhabit the moment and trust the audience to meet them there.

I knew the film depended on finding someone who could communicate enormous emotional complexity with very little dialogue. Lu has that rare ability. She's incredibly precise but never mechanical. Even in silence, she's constantly thinking, and the camera captures it. So much of Boss Li's journey happens internally, and Lu trusted the audience enough not to explain it.

She's also a joy to work with. Despite her remarkable career, she fully embraced the realities of a very independent production. She brought warmth, energy, and a willingness to get down and dirty alongside the rest of us. That generosity of spirit made a real difference.

Chongqing as the setting:

I've been travelling to Chongqing for more than twenty years. I lived there in 2006 while filming *Up the Yangtze*, and even then the city felt surreal—like something out of *Blade Runner*. Returning over the years, I've watched it transform at an astonishing pace. Today it feels almost futuristic.

It was also in Chongqing that I witnessed the highway tragedy that inspired *The Highway*. The city has become deeply intertwined with both my personal life and my filmmaking.

Chongqing is the largest municipality in the world, with more than 30 million people. Known as the Detroit of China for its automobile industry, it fascinates me because extraordinary modernization exists alongside much older ways of life, sometimes only a few kilometres apart.

That tension is the heart of the film. I couldn't imagine setting *The Highway* anywhere else.
